# Free home energy assessments in rural Rother

With high energy prices it can be difficult to keep your home warm, especially if it is an older building. But there are lots of ways a home can be upgraded to keep warm with less energy – the difficult bit is knowing what will work best for your home, and how to pay for it.

We are here to help you with this – the Local Energy Advice Demonstrator can provide a free home energy assessment (which would normally cost up to £500) that will analyse your home's energy efficiency and set out the options for making improvements. We can also help you with filling in forms and accessing grants that may be available to help cover the cost of any work.

The free energy assessments are provided for:

- homes that are 'hard to treat', such as those with solid walls, timber construction, not on mains gas, listed buildings or in a conservation zone, or;
- households that are 'hard to reach', for example because they are not online, have health problems, have disabilities or are unable to afford to heat their home.
