Protecting your home

In East Sussex, there is high pressure on housing. It is more important than ever to try to keep paying your rent. If you do fall behind with your rent, contact your local council's housing team for advice straight away. If you are not eligible to receive housing benefits, you can also try talking to your landlord to negotiate a repayment plan.

It is crucial to avoid eviction.
